

# Proactive Signage Maintenance Checklist

Routine maintenance prevents damage, reduces replacement costs, and ensures signs maintain their effectiveness.

MAINTENANCE TASK	RECOMMENDED FREQUENCY	ACTION STEPS	BEST PRACTICES
1. General Cleaning	Monthly for indoor signs, Bi-weekly for outdoor signs	Wipe signs with a microfiber cloth and mild detergent	Avoid harsh chemicals that can damage finishes
2. Dust & Dirt Removal	Weekly	Use soft brushes or compressed air for hard-to-reach areas	For digital and LED screens, use anti-static spray to minimize dust buildup
3. Inspect Sign Mounting & Hardware	Every 3 Months	Check bolts, brackets, and mounting structures for looseness or corrosion	Tighten loose fasteners and replace rusted hardware to prevent falling hazards
4. Check for Peeling Vinyl or Graphics	Every 2 Months	Look for signs of peeling, cracking, or bubbling in vinyl graphics	Use a heat gun to re-adhere edges; replace severely damaged sections
5. Protective Coating Application	Every 6 Months	Apply UV-resistant and waterproof coatings	Protects against sun fading and water damage
6. LED and Neon Signage Inspection	Every 3 Months	Test brightness levels, check for flickering lights or dark spots	Replace dim or non-functional bulbs immediately
7. Power Source & Electrical Check	Every 6 Months	Inspect wiring, power supply, and connections for safety hazards	If wires are exposed or frayed, call a professional for repair
8. Check for Rust & Corrosion on Metal Signs	Every 4 Months	Inspect sign edges and screws for oxidation	Use a rust remover and apply a corrosion-resistant coating
9. Glass & Acrylic Signage Care	Monthly	Clean with streak-free glass cleaner or mild soap	Avoid abrasive cleaners that can scratch surfaces
10. Pressure Wash Outdoor Signage	Every 6 Months	Use low-pressure washing to remove deep-seated grime on durable signs	Avoid high-pressure settings that may damage delicate surfaces
11. Repainting & Touch-Ups for Metal Signs	Annually	Apply a fresh coat of weather-resistant paint if fading or chipping is visible	Choose paint with UV protection to extend color vibrancy
12. Inspect Weatherproof Seals for Wooden Signs	Every 6 Months	Check for moisture absorption, cracking, or peeling protective layers	Reapply waterproof sealant to prevent rot and warping
13. Storage for Seasonal or Temporary Banners	Before and After Each Use	Store banners rolled up in a dry, cool place to prevent creases and mold growth	Avoid storing in damp areas to prevent mildew buildup
14. Check for Mold & Mildew in Humid Climates	Every 3 Months	Inspect for dark spots or moisture buildup, especially in shaded areas	Use a mildew remover and improve air circulation around the sign
15. Structural Integrity Check for Large Outdoor Signs	Annually	Inspect poles, bases, and brackets for cracks or weakening	Reinforce support structures if signs are exposed to strong winds or storms
16. Test Signage Visibility at Different Times of Day	Every 6 Months	Evaluate how the sign appears in daylight and nighttime conditions	Adjust lighting or reposition signs to enhance visibility
17. Graffiti & Vandalism Inspection	Weekly for high-traffic areas	Look for unwanted markings, scratches, or defacement	Use anti-graffiti coatings for easier cleaning and deterrence
18. Verify Branding Consistency	Annually	Check if colors, fonts, and logos still match your company's brand identity	Update signage if rebranding or style changes have occurred
